# Cashmere Valley Record Digitization Project—completed! 114 years (1907 to 2020) of the Cashmere Valley Record are now digitized and free to access at washingtondigitalnewspapers.org.



The Friends of Old Mission History Group (which included our late WAGS member Dick Brender) contacted Washington State Digital Newspapers, who had in-house people and subcontractors who did the actual digitizing. The state is hosting the Cashmere newspapers on the digital newspapers website for free. (Note that the *Wenatchee World* is also on the site from 1905 to 1910; *Leavenworth Echo* from 1904 to 2022.) Click on Chelan County on their map, select *Cashmere Valley Record* and have fun browsing!

#### WAGS at a crossroads!

Our beloved WAGS organization is a treasure to our community. Unfortunately, as communities change, genealogical and historical societies need to change with them to survive. There are several things that have evolved that require change from us:

#### The Museum is remodeling and we must find a new space.

What kind of space do we need? Most of our WAGS business and research is completed online. Do we still need research computers for the community or do we just need a couple for our volunteers? Should we become more of a workshop for digitizing, with

our main community outreach being our programs? Where do we find our next generation of volunteers?

#### Is our WAGS Library still viable?

Although we have some amazing research and community treasures in our library, the number of visitors has dwindled. Our books and journals are neglected. Are they still treasures if no one sees them?! What steps should WAGS take to make these treasures available to more people? Do we maintain ownership or hand them off to an organization with more resources?

#### Who can help?

Our WAGS board is chugging along with ideas. We have so many ideas and so little time that we feel like we're not making headway into the many projects we'd love to complete. **We need your input!** Which direction should we go? What tasks should we do? Who can help?

We plan to have a special executive board strategy meeting (as yet unscheduled) to discuss these and other questions and topics. Once we've identified our limits—both monetary and people-hours—we'll be coming to you, our members, for a sanity check on our new direction.
