Sailing in uncharted territory

get the picture. The board has met to look at our stats—how many patrons are using our library now that so much is online? And are our subscriptions (MyHeritage, Ancestry) getting the kind of traffic we expected? What should we pare down? What should we keep? The library committee has also met in constructive discussion.

We haven't come to a definite decision—maybe deciding needs to be a slower process than we first thought. The best we've come up with is turning our library into a "by appointment" place, and have our volunteers do work sessions to digitize our holdings and increase our online footprint.

We will soon make a focused appeal to the community and see what might be out there to fit our needs. NCWLife wants to do an article about our situation.

Urgent Appeal: Help Wenatchee Area Genealogical Society Find a New Home!

Our History Needs a Future! Wenatchee Area Genealogical Society (WAGS) is URGENTLY seeking a new location. Due to upcoming construction plans at our current home in the Museum, we need to find a new space to continue serving our community and preserving the rich history of North Central Washington.

For years, WAGS has been a vital resource for residents exploring their roots, offering access to invaluable historical records, research assistance, and a dedicated space for discovery. Now, we need your help to ensure this crucial work continues.

What We're Looking For:

We are seeking **donated or low-cost space** that can accommodate our needs. We dream of maintaining a public space to keep our research library open and accessible to everyone. However, we recognize the challenges and are flexible. We are considering solutions that enable secure storage of our extensive collections and a reduced public-facing footprint, while maintaining access to our collections and digitization equipment.

Our Current Space & Needs:

- Size: We currently occupy 1400 sq ft.
- Storage is Key: We have approximately 180 linear feet of bookcases and file cabinets housing irreplaceable historical documents and research materials.
- Essential Operations: A dedicated digitizing workspace, space for 2 research
 computers on desks for public and volunteer use, administrative desks with a
 computer, printer, and copier, a small conference table for meetings and collaborative
 research.

Flexibility is Possible: While we cherish the idea of a full library space, we are adaptable. We could potentially share some desk space and conference room facilities. However, a critical requirement is an **area that can be secured and closed to the public when a WAGS librarian or volunteer is not available.**

Why This Matters to the Wenatchee Valley:

WAGS is more than just a collection of old documents; we are storykeepers, educators, and connectors. We help people uncover their family histories, understand the legacies of those who built our community, and preserve these narratives for future generations. Losing a physical space jeopardizes our ability to:

- Provide public access to unique local historical and genealogical records.
- Offer workshops and assistance to community members researching their heritage.
- Continue our important digitalization projects that preserve fragile materials and make them more widely accessible.
- Collaborate with other local historical and cultural organizations.

How You Can Help:

- **Do you know of a suitable donated or low-cost space?** This could be in a public building, a shared non-profit space, a commercial property with a community-minded owner, or any other potential location.
- Can you offer connections to property owners or managers who might be willing to help?
- **Share this appeal far and wide!** The more people who know about our need, the greater the chance of finding a solution.
- Offer ideas or suggestions. We are open to creative solutions!

This is a significant challenge, but we believe in the generosity and community spirit of the Wenatchee area. Your support can help us find a new home where we can continue to connect, collect, and protect family histories for years to come.
